It will be used to assess improvements in your child's writing from time to time.
GRAMMAR: Now, each class is working through a grade-level, appropriate grammar review before their reading day. This will be used as an assessment tool as well.
LITERATURE: Fridays are usually reserved for reading the assigned class book, so remind your SEVENTH AND EIGHTH GRADERS to come with earbuds and charged Chromebooks. SIXTH

GRADERS will listen to their second audio chapter with me that day with a listening quiz immediately following. This month, all students will also take the STAR reading exam to establish a baseline for this new school year. I plan to have them test with this quarterly and will give them a grade in Literature for it each time. Scores in my gradebook for this are dependent on whether the student's reading level improves ( $84-100 \%$ grading scale), remains stagnant ( $70-83 \%$ ), or worsens ( $69 \%$ or below). Please make sure they are reading at home.
VOCABULARY: Our current class word is INCREDULOUS. Students must correctly use this word in at least one of their writing assignments before the new one is posted in about two weeks. They will begin working in their workbooks next week.
SCIENCE - Mrs. Porter-Cain: Hey all you Cardinal fans!! I hope everyone enjoyed their three-day weekend with these awesome kiddos!
As I hope your kids are learning, Science is EVERYWHERE and Science NEVER STOPS! 6th Grade- we are still plugging away at matter! Matter is everything because everything matters!
